What is the DIS and what can users expect from the new DIS Rules? The goal of the 2018 DIS Arbitration Rules (DIS Rules) was to increase efficiency, transparency and predictability. Therefore, the DIS Rules now contain annexes on “Measures for Increasing Procedural Efficiency” and on “Expedited Proceedings”. When it comes to the degree of institutional supervision, the DIS Rules adopt, from a common law perspective, a middle ground by intensifying the degree of oversight compared to the old Rules while they abstain from reaching as far as other institutions do.

Furthermore, the DIS Rules offer other measures to increase time and cost efficiency such as the application of written witness statements, limiting document production requests and providing the parties with a preliminary non-binding assessment of factual or legal issues.
